If you are using any other sound card interface, bring your manual and we will attempt to assist. Acoustical coupling assistance will be available.

Download and install the latest version of fldigi if you are running anything prior to 3.20.0. Current version is 3.23.12. There is a newer Beta version available (not recommended at this time).

Frequencies:

440.500 simplex - Yucca Valley

440.580 simplex - Twentynine Palms

144.910 simplex - Link between Twentynine Palms and Yucca Valley

All frequencies have a tone squelch/enc.dec of 110.9

These frequencies are also used on a cross band repeater on Paxton. It is available 24/7 for general use and testing of equipment. If you can reach the 146.790 repeater with a handheld you should be able to reach the cross band repeater.

For those who cannot reach either the Yucca Valley or Twentynine Palms cross band repeater, use the link frequency.
